Parent Questionnaire

Thank you to everyone who responded to our questionnaire on communication, we received 31 responses at Copdock and 28 at Bentley. From the results of the questionnaire we can clearly see that communication is viewed positively by parents and for the most part is effective and efficient.

The following feedback will be used to support us to review practice for the new school year in September.

- As the vast majority of people access information via email, we will continue to use this as our main form of communication. We will continue to use the website as an additional place for the weekly news and letters sent home, to ensure access is available to everyone if they mislay the email. - It was great to hear you find workshops helpful. We will try workshop sessions again in the evening alongside some afternoon ones. On September 11th we will be holding a Welcome Information Evening so parents can meet all teachers and other parents informally, starting the year with positive interaction and discussion around life in each class. More information will be shared about this but keep the date free!

Actions for consideration:

- Information via calendar listings on the website:
 we do try to separate the schools in the spider
 APP but will look at this again to ensure it is clear
 in which school an event is happening. Only 2
 people said they use the website for information,
 so we need to consider the workload associated
 with adding extra information to listings if it is
 not useful to many parents.
- Homework and progress information will be discussed by the staff team ready for the new school year. An update on expectations and the consistent approaches for sharing information with you, will be discussed at the parents meeting on 11th September. We hope to see you there.
- We do try to give notice of things coming up as part of our weekly news but will continue to work on providing as much notice as possible for events and activities. We are reviewing our curriculum plans so this should be easier to accommodate. All topic webs will be available on the website and we will continue to include details about events in the weekly news for parents to keep a closer eye on. We also want to be responsive to local or national events so our children have the best experiences available to them. For this reason, we may have some activities which occur within a flexible timeframe.

We hope these changes will continue to support effective communication going forward.

SATs Results

Congratulations once again to children and staff for the successful results following SATs tests in May. Both schools achieved above the provisional national results (in brackets) as detailed below.

Bentley: Reading 88% (73%), Writing 88% (78%), Maths 100% (79%)

Copdock: Reading 100% (73%), Writing 90% (78%), Maths 100% (79%)

Results also highlighted the encouragement and additional challenge provided for pupils working at 'greater depth', with many of our children achieving the higher standards in these core subjects too.
