Questions in the film to consider

- Would you leave your front door wide open?
- Would you hang up personal pictures of yourself in a public place for everyone to see?
- Would you tell just anyone where you lived?
- Would you speak to someone you had never met like they were your best friend?
- Would you let a stranger take a copy of all your personal photos?
- Do you use the internet to talk to your friends?



Consider these:

- Do you have your own personal profile online?
- Do you have people on it as friends that you don't know?
- Do you have pictures on your profile that you wouldn't want your parents to see?
- Can anyone see or change those photos?
- Is it possible for someone to find out where you live or go to school?
- Are you more careful about your safety in the real world than in the online world?



Is it time you changed your online habits? What can you do to keep yourself safe online?
