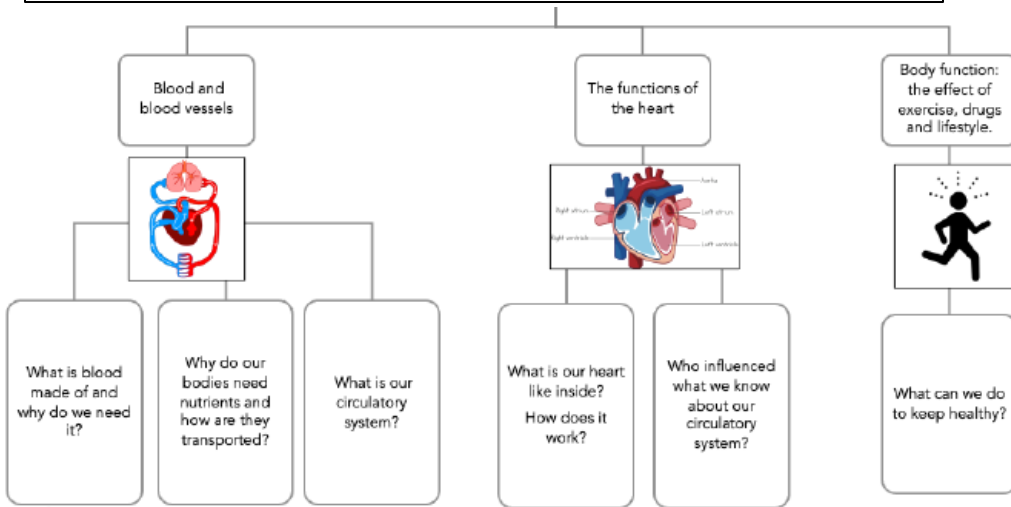


In English, we will be writing explanation texts

In Science, we will be studying Animals, including humans - the circulatory system



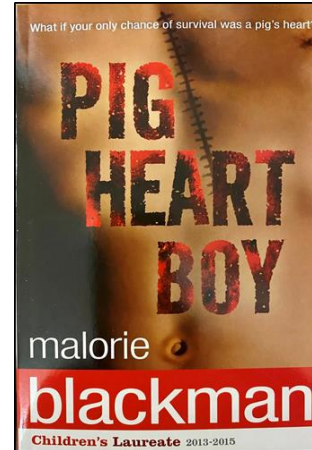
In DT, we will be looking at structures

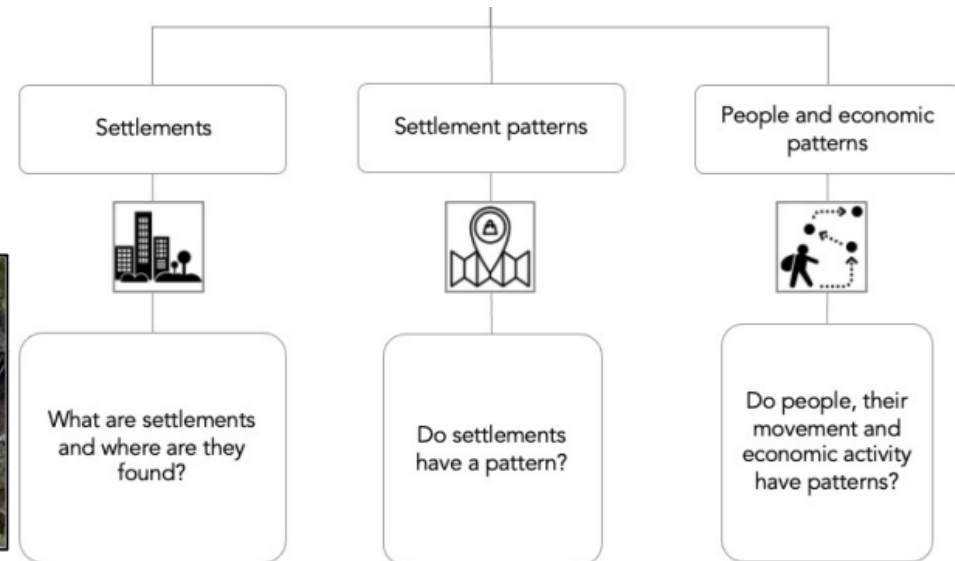
Settlements, land use and economic activity

Key Vocabulary	Definition	Key Vocabulary	Definition
Location	A place where something is located.	Circulation	Movement around something, e.g. the blood around the body.
Distribute	Share something.	Chamber	A space within something e.g. a heart.
Consumption	Use of energy, food or materials.	Vessel	A tube carrying fluid around the body.
Navigable	Wide and deep enough for ships and boats to sail on.	Ventricle	One of the lower cavities of the heart.
Struts	Struts are rods or bars forming part of a framework and designed to resist compression.	Capillary	Thin blood vessel that forms part of a network between the arteries and veins.
Mitre	A joint made between two pieces of wood or other material at an angle of 90°, such that the line of junction bisects this angle.	Platelet	Cell fragment that aids blood clotting.

UKS2 What is the great significance of the 'Eucharist' to Christians?

Prior learning:

Christians are followers of Jesus, the saviour of the world. He died but came back to life. This is good news.

A cross reminds Christians of his sacrifice, but is also a sign of commitment and God's love.

In the Gospel, Jesus told parables to teach about God's Kingdom and the right way to live. Christians serve others as a response to being saved.

God offers us forgiveness.

The Holy Spirit reminds Christians God is always with them. This gives them strength.

What should we know?

The **Eucharist** is when Christians give thanks for bread and wine in memory of Jesus. It is a central act of worship.

Christians believe:

- It is important to give thanks to God. It is a Christian duty.
- During the Lord's Supper, the Passover feast with his disciples on the evening before he was betrayed, Jesus commanded his followers to remember him.
- The Eucharist is a reminder of Jesus' sacrifice on their behalf but also of things which should make them glad: of God's amazing love and forgiveness.



The Last Supper

The Eucharist reminds Christians to give thanks daily.
