We understand that families have hectic lives. Therefore, as a school, we have agreed what is an acceptable amount of homework to be completed, but please come and speak to me if you child is struggling.

Reading Challenge – read 5 x week for 5-10 minutes. A good time to do this is bedtime or as soon as you get in from school. Please write in their orange reading diary for each read. The diary is checked on a Friday and anyone who has completed 5 reads will get a sticker which they then collect towards certificates.

Spellings – 5 minutes every day, written in a red spelling book to practise in. Test on Tuesday.

Key word packet – 5 minutes a day, tested on a Wednesday. This hasn't started yet.

After half term, Year 2 will have a page of a maths book a week.

Year 2 may receive additional homework as they approach SATS.

Reading book bingo – children can work towards reading all of the books on the book bingo for their year group. These can be borrowed from public library.
