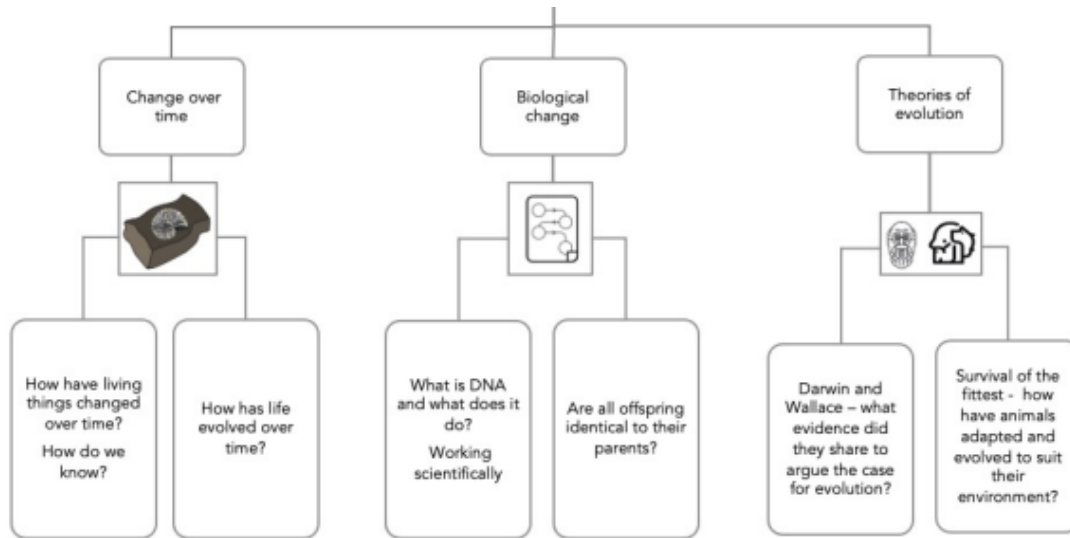


## In Science, we will be investigating Evolution and Inheritance

### How has trade changed in East Anglia since Medieval Times?

#### In English, we will be writing a narrative based on 'The Journey'

**As authors** we will look at the picture book 'The Journey' by Francesca Sanna which introduces a powerful and moving perspective on migration for readers of all ages. Told through the eyes of a young girl, the story explores the unimaginable decisions made as a mother and her two children are forced to flee their home and everyone they know to escape the turmoil of war.

### In History, we will be looking at trade in East Anglia since Medieval Times

**As historians** we will be investigating:

- What happened at the Battle of Hastings and what was the affect on everyday life?
- What was East Anglia like in medieval times?
- How did trade develop in East Anglia during the 12<sup>th</sup>, 13<sup>th</sup> and 14<sup>th</sup> centuries?
- Why was East Anglia so important in the development of trade?
- How did Lavenham contribute to the wool trade?
- What is trade like in East Anglia today?



### During PSHE we will be focusing on rights, rules and responsibilities

We will learn about: the basic rights of children and who is responsible for ensuring they are achieved; how rights, rules and responsibilities affect the class and school; how there may be differences and sometimes conflict between rights and responsibilities at home and at school; rules and laws in society and the role of MPs and councillors.



### In Art, we will be looking at textiles

**As artists** we will be using wool to create examples of cloth, developing skills such as weaving and knitting.

**In RE, we will be looking at why the Gospel is such good news to Christians**

**Prior learning:**  
Christians are followers of Jesus, the saviour of the world. He died but came back to life.

A cross reminds Christians of his sacrifice, but is also a sign of commitment and God's love.

Jesus told parables to teach about God's Kingdom and the right way to live. Christians serve others as a response to being saved.


God offers us forgiveness.

The Holy Spirit reminds Christians God is always with them. He gives them strength.

**What should we know?**  
Remember, to Christians, Jesus is good news.

**Christians believe:**

- Jesus is the saviour of the world. This is good news.
- The Gospels are the books of Matthew, Mark, Luke and John. They are found in the Bible and tell the stories of Jesus.
- Christians live by the Bible and by the things Jesus said.
- The teachings of Jesus have authority in their life.
