

KS1 Why is learning to do good deeds so important to Jewish people?

What should we know?

Mitzvah is the Jewish word for good deed or action. It is something God asks all Jews to do.

Jews believe it's a mitzvah (good deed) to:

- HELP others in need.
- WELCOME others.
- GIVE money to help other people
- CARE for the world.
