Differentiation:

Questions 1, 4 and 7 (Varied Fluency)

Developing Identify simple single clause sentences which contain one error. Using Y1 Word List.

Expected Identify single clause sentences with added detail which contain more than one error. Using Y1 Word List.

Greater Depth Identify single and multi-clause sentences including the conjunction 'and', which contain more than one error. Using Y1/2 Word List.

Questions 2, 5 and 8 (Varied Fluency)

Developing Match simple single clause sentences correctly. Using Y1 Word List.

Expected Match single clause sentences with added detail correctly. Using Y1 Word List.

Greater Depth Match single and multi-clause sentences including the conjunction 'and', correctly. Using Y1/2 Word List.

Questions 3, 6 and 9 (Application and Reasoning)

Developing Add capital letters or full stops to simple single clause sentences. Using Y1 Word List.

Expected Add capital letters or full stops to single clause sentences with added detail. Using Y1 Word List.

Greater Depth Add capital letters and full stops to single and multi-clause sentences including the conjunction 'and'. Using Y1/2 Word List.
