


Syrian Refugee Crisis - Teacher Questions

- Where has this picture been taken? In a Syrian refugee camp.
- What can you see in the picture? Tents, ropes, sandy/dirt ground, a Syrian refugee.
- What are the tents made out of? Fabric, cloth, rugs, ropes etc.
- Where do you think the lady in the picture is going? Back to her tent.
- How are the refugees' homes different to yours? Personal response, e.g. I live in a house with lots of rooms. My house has windows and a front door etc.
- How do you think you would feel if you had to leave your home and live in a refugee camp? Personal response, e.g. I would be scared and I would want to go back home.
- What would you miss about your home if you had to leave and stay in a refugee camp? Personal response, e.g. I would miss my bedroom and my toys. I would miss being able to play in the back garden.
- How do you think the lady in the picture is feeling? Personal response, e.g. she might be feeling sad and she might miss her home and family. She may be feeling relieved that she is in a safer place.
- Have you slept in a tent before? What was it like? If not, what do you think it would be like? Personal response, e.g. I went camping and it was fun but I sleep better in my bed at home.
- Would you like to visit the camp? Personal response, e.g. Yes, because I would like to see inside the tents and meet the people who live there. No, because it looks really crowded.
