### Inside a Refugee Camp - Oral Teacher Questions

- What do you think will happen to all the garbage and tents in the picture? There
  are a lot of possibilities but two answers could be they are going to stay because
  refugee camps are still needed, or they will be cleared up (including the tents) and
  the refugees sent elsewhere.
- 2. Why are there no people in the picture? The people could be inside their tents or elsewhere.
- 3. Why is this refugee camp needed? There is not enough room for all of the refugees so they need somewhere to stay while they wait to move to safer countries.
- 4. Have you ever slept in a tent or been camping? Personal response, ensure the answer is about being in a tent or camping.
- 5. Does this look like a normal camp site? No, normal campsites would not be full of litter or have tents so close together. A normal campsite would require people to tidy up after themselves and may even provide clean, running water and cooking facilities.
- 6. If you could make a tent, what would you make it from and why? Personal response using clues from the image such as, a waterproof material to stop the water leaking inside.
- 7. What types of garbage can you see in the picture? Cardboard boxes, plastic boxes, a tyre, a bin, food waste, tins, etc.
- 8. What do you do in your school with different types of garbage you have? Personal response but look for links to rubbish and recycling.
- 9. Identify ONE question you would like to ask about this scene. Ensure the question links to the image/topic of refugee camps.
- 10. The title for the picture is Inside a Refugee Camp. Why do you think this title was chosen? This picture shows what life is like inside a refugee camp. It makes the audience aware that some refugees are currently living in tents which are close together and have lots of rubbish close by.
- 11. If you were a refugee living here, how would you feel? Why? Personal response.
- 12. What is the weather like in the picture? Sunny, blue sky, dry and nice.
- 13. Why is there a big puddle of dirty water in the middle of the garbage? There is no where for the dirty water to go so it forms a large, dirty puddle.
