Explore beginnings with Beethoven...

This activity is all about beginnings and Beethoven with one of the most famous motifs in musical history!

First...

Join Barney Horwood in exploring the music of Beethoven and one of the most famous motifs in musical history. (It has even been used in pop songs!)

Doctor Who composer Segun Akinola explores beginnings and sets a creative challenge based on Beethoven's famous opening and the start of the BBC Proms.

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**Activity 4:** Here's your piece for this week: If you don't have your instrument, remember to

listen, and learn the tune and rhythms anyway to play in class later. You can also use any other instruments you may have such as a keyboard or recorder.

### Warm Up:

Start with just your flute head joint. Play some long notes on your flute headjoint - can you remember how to get the different high and low sounds on the headjoint? Remember to start each note with 'T'.

Assemble the rest of your flute. Make sure it's lined up correctly, like in the picture.





2. Name the notes.
3. Practice the fingers along to the backing track. Then see if you can play it.
