<p>Topic (45 mins) 1:00-2:00</p>	<p>MUSIC (30 mins) Out and about Let's go shopping(1) In today's music time, we will be imagining a trip to the market. We will use counting rhymes to work on rhythm and beat, and use fruit names to make up some funky rhythms.</p>	<p>Science (45 min) Float & Sink Experiment Carrying on from last week, we will be scientists and explore whether items we find around our house float or sink and sort them into two piles, depending on whether they float or sink. Do the Big Garden Bird Watch.</p>	<p>PSHE (30 mins) I give what I expect in return In today's lesson you explore what kindness is and think about how we can display it through kind words and kind actions. You will think about showing respect, to receive it back in return. You will learn different gestures to communicate kindness and think about feelings that arise through showing and receiving kindness. By the end, you will create a sequence of gestures to show kindness and respect.</p>	<p>Geography (45 mins) What can see outside in Winter? We will identify things that we can see outside in winter. We will think about the colours of the season and create a drawing of things that we can see on a winter walk. You could extend this lesson by comparing seasons, the things you might see outside and the colours you might use to represent each season. If you don't have glitter, you could always add cotton wool or anything else that could represent snow or ice.</p>	<p>RE (30 mins) What does the parable of the Lost Coin tell you about God? (When a person decides to love God, God celebrates like the lady did when she found the lost coin) The Lost Coin Ask your grown-up to show you different examples of coins. When do we use coins? Can you name some of them? Draw around a circle shape and design your own coin or do some coin rubbings. National Marine Aquarium Mermaid Tales at 1:30-1:45pm (Early Years) Who wants to meet a real mermaid? Well you can during this session, where Marina our resident Mermaid will read a short story.</p>
